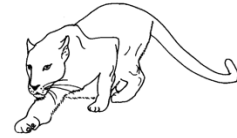

Campsite

Sleeping and cooking will be by Patrol method

Webelos II dens to be inspected by camp staff. We must set a good example. Inspection criteria – American and troop flag, neat general appearance of campsite, personal equipment properly stowed, food properly stowed including coolers off the ground, garbage stored off the ground, duty roster posted, fires away from tents and fire buckets for each tent.

Service Responsibilities

Work groups assigned by SPL will rotate every period. Also, each group will have a break morning and afternoon.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP BROSIG - SEALY, TEXAS

Take Interstate 10, traveling West from Houston, to Sealy, TX, Exit at State Highway 36.

From the traffic light on Highway 36 where you exit from I-10, turn left (North) and go 5.1 miles until you pass the intersection with Farm Road 331. Another 0.6 miles past 331 is Trenckmann (a blacktop road to the left – West). Just before Trenckmann Road you will see a large Church on the left (west) side of highway 36.

The road is hard to see at night. On the S.W. corner is a street sign identifying the road as Trenckmann Road; on the N.W. corner is a Camp Brosig sign.

Go 1.6 miles on Trenckmann Road to Camp Brosig gate on the left (south).

Troop 1089 camps in the field at the far southwest end of Camp Brosig. Follow the entrance road as far as possible and we will be on the right. Adults will camp on the hill on the right end of the campsite.

No cars are allowed in the campsite.

Total time for the drive from Houston is approximately one hour.
